The only shortcoming is the failure to include more topics and greater depth in each chapter, since the concept of explaining basic mechanisms of neonatal disease could fill a much larger book. Assessment: Few books can compare to this one. The standard textbook for neonatal physiology and biochemistry is *Fetal and Neonatal Physiology*, 3rd edition, Polin et al. (Elsevier, 2004), a monster of a book in two volumes and nearly 2,000 pages.
